

# The Old Country-house in Gyomaendrőd



The building consists of four rooms: a kitchen; a small room (known as “small house”); a big room (also known as “big house”); and a pantry.

The Country House of Endrőd presents the ethnographical and local historical heritage of the rural life of Endrőd.



The house was built by István Hunya, a landowner from





The wooden columns on the porch of the country house built in 1862 were drifted down on the Körös River from Transylvania.

Its furniture exhibits the authentic environment of the rural life of Endrőd at the end of the 19th century.



The facade of the building is stuccoed with date on the pediment; it has a string course and a porch with brick columns which was restored in 1976.

**In the neighboring house there is an expanding collection of local history. The local government purchased this building in 2000.**



**The building was rebuilt in the 1930s and now some exhibitions are displayed in it. Its style can be described as any other houses in the town and its form is a long L-shape. The rooms open from one to another.**
